

Weed management resources update

The 2020 edition of Turfgrass Weed Control for Professionals is a publication annually available through Purdue Extension. The cover this year features the weed everyone loves to hate, yellow nutsedge! Updated annually and contains information and data provided by UNL turf faculty and turf experts throughout the US to address regional differences in weed populations and control strategies. The guide has high quality images and descriptions of more than 100 weeds, describes control strategies for difficult weeds, and comprehensively summarizes turfgrass herbicide efficacy and safety on turfgrass species (including buffalograss). Also available on the site is an excellent turfgrass weed poster, suitable for framing, or, at the very least, posting in the shop at your facility.

An important first step to weed management is properly identifying these plants. This poster identifies the most common weeds found in cool-season turf. The poster format can be utilized in the breakroom, chemical room, maintenance shop, or equipment trailer or employee education.
