Spring is right around the corner as the grass is starting to grow and people are starting to fire up their irrigation systems. While winter is still fresh in our minds, we would like to invite you to a free field day seminar located at both the John Seaton Anderson Turfgrass Research Facility (Mead, NE) on March 30, and at Awarii Dunes (Axtell, NE) on April 1. Studies highlighted at the Mead site include traditional desiccation prevention practices vs. new practices, winterkill recovery techniques, and an evaluation of covers and insulation on bermudagrass greens. At Awarii Dunes, the research that will be highlighted focuses on traditional desiccation prevention practices vs. new practices. This is a casual event and each seminar at both locations will be conducted with short presentations followed by an open, informal discussion. We encourage you to take time out of your busy spring to come see firsthand what worked at these sites. Field days for both locations will start at 1 p.m. and we will meet on the turf plots at the Mead site, and at the clubhouse parking lot at Awarii Dunes. The event is free but pre-registration is required by March 29, so plans can be made for teaching resources and tour logistics.
