

**UNL Turf Program Now Hiring JSA Turf Center Manager
February 27, 2015**

The Department of Agronomy and Horticulture is hiring a new Station Manager at the John Seaton Anderson Turf Research Center in Mead, NE. This research facility consists of 75 acres of irrigated turf and ornamental research which is essential to the turfgrass research effort at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. The JSA Turf Center houses a variety of research plots including several research putting greens, fairways, sport turf, and lawn areas. The breeding program also has 3,000+ accessions of buffalograss and other native grasses at the Center. The center also hosts annual and special events such as the Turfgrass Field Day.

The JSA Turf Research Center Research Manager is an essential position within the UNL Turfgrass Program. The research manager oversees all aspects of the facility and assists with research on East Campus. This person will work directly with the UNL turfgrass faculty to conduct high caliber and highly applicable research. Some responsibilities include plot and equipment maintenance, management of the center's budget and staff, direct contribution toward turfgrass research projects, and assistance with extension activities such as Turfgrass Field Day. The manager also is responsible for plot renovation projects.

We are looking for candidates with a Bachelor of Science degree with a minimum four years of management experience. A Master of Science degree and research field experience is preferred. If you'd ever considered a career in support of turfgrass research and would enjoy a very dynamic working environment we encourage you to apply.
